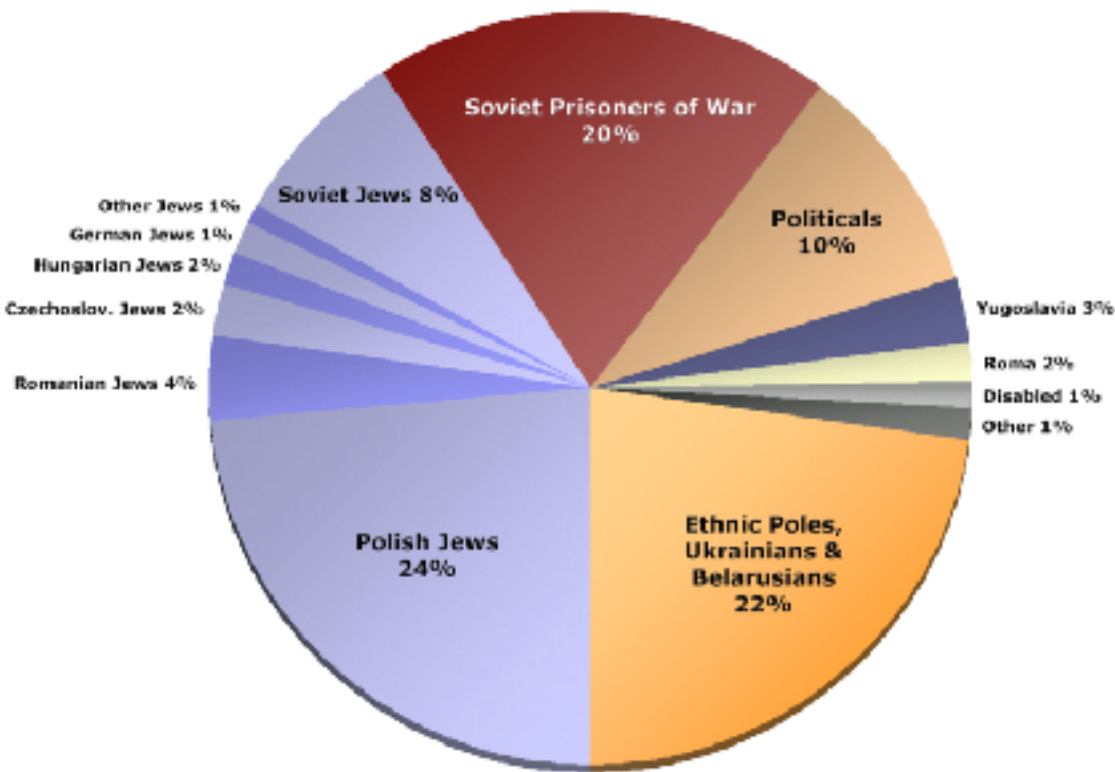


The Causes, Events, and Effects of the Holocaust.

Looking back during the time of the Holocaust showed how the Jewish population was significantly affected. Approximately six million Jews had lost their lives during this time. Many communities were shattered, and those who had survived had been determined to leave Europe or to even start a new life in Israel or to travel to the United States. The population in Europe was about 9.5 million people, but the Jewish population was 3.5 million. In 1933, Poland had the largest population of Jewish communities in Europe that numbered over three million Jews. By 1950 the Jewish people had taken a massive hit in their numbers, and the people dropped to 45 thousand Jews. The Soviet Union has the most significant known remaining population of two million Jews. Though this number didn't last a very long time, from two million then to 757,000 until the community reached 280 thousand. From what these numbers show us is that the Jewish population was great until Germany came in and wiped most of them out.

If we want to stop the Genocides in the future how will we do it? We need to demand action. We can prevent massive atrocities that require the will of the politics. It is a must that we speak up and demand that the government leaders make the wise choice to stop crimes. If we can have our leaders make the correct decisions in this world, then the Genocides will not provide of what we have seen with the Holocaust.
